## Voter Information

### Who can vote?

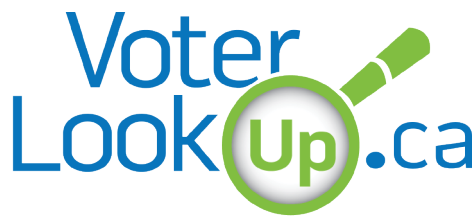
Canadian citizens living in Lakeshore can vote if they are:

- At least 18 years of age.
- A property owner/tenant, or the spouse/partner of an owner/tenant
- Not prohibited from voting under the Municipal Elections Act

**Reminder:** Identification including proof of residency is required to vote.

To run for an a seat on Council or a School Board, you must meet the qualifications listed on:

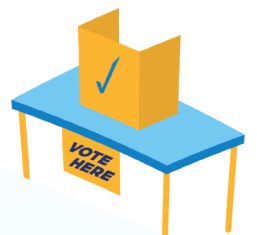

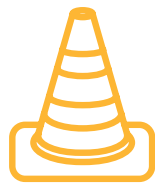

## New Load Restrictions in Effect on Local Roads

By-law aims to reduce impact of heavy vehicles and extend life of Lakeshore's roads

In April, Council approved a by-law amendment to introduce year-round load restrictions on all of Lakeshore's Class B Roads.

Some exceptions apply. Truck traffic taking the most direct routes from non-restricted roads for normal deliveries to local properties, for example, may be permitted.

As part of the rollout of new restrictions, signage will be installed throughout Lakeshore.

## Final Tax & Water Bill Reminders

### Final property tax bills

Mailed in June with installments due:

- Friday, July 29
- Friday, October 31

### Supplementary tax bills

Issued for new homes, and after improvements/renovations to a property or a change in its use. Bills will be mailed between July and November, with two installments due by end of 2022.

### Water bill due dates

- Area 1 (east Belle River & east of Rochester Townline): July 29, September 30, and November 30.
- Area 2 (West of Rochester Townline): August 31, October 31, December 22.
